SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION NO. 1

BUDGET AND DETAILS OF EACH PROJECT

(projects are in sequence of importance)

Background:

The Hungarian Rugby Federation was established in 1990 although rugby was started in the late 70s in Hungary (and according to our latest researches there was another period between 1968 and 1973 when a championship with 5 sides was maintained in Hungary by an Italian diplomat). Now there are 15 clubs in Hungary playing in two divisions and in the first division it is obligatory for all clubs to play a cadet team (U15).

The fist President and its staff carried rather careless financial activity, which resulted massive debts in 1993 when a new presidency was elected. In spite the careful and hard work of the new establishment this debt still results that it is very difficult to create the minimally necessary financial resources for operation. The Federation has only one permanent full time associate, namely Mrs Ria Ispánné who is a professional sport organiser. Another position is sponsored this year by the IRFB grant for Mr Attila Kardos who is the Youth Development Officer and we would like to receive fund for his further employment (see due review on his activity at Annex 1.).

Thanks to the IRFB grant supplied us in the middle of this year roughly in 80 schools rugby was started in various ways. The potential to expand this sport in Hungary looks much sharper than ever before.

The ongoing processes urge us to establish a firmer infrastructure background, even if it is composited by a network of volunteers. We are dedicated to implement and utilise the potential as professionally as it is possible stepping up in the ladder of a learning process.

Our application contains three major points:

- 1. Another one year funding of the Youth Development Officer and a complementer mentorship system.
- 2. Final construction and completion works of a rugby stadium close to Budapest, namely in Százhalombatta, where the local government of the town already spent major amounts on it.
- 3. Preparation of a Junior National Team that will go to Cardiff in 1999.

The application projects, in priority, for IRS-OSS in December 1997:

1. Position of a Federation Development Officer for Students (hereinafter DOS)

Job description (roughly the same as in the last year application:

- In the whole area of Hungary building up the elemental cristalling points of rugby sport in elementary schools, secondary schools and where possible at living areas. Organisation and holding of trainings for the successfully set student teams, later on the establishment and organisation of regional and country student championships. The implementation steps of the above mentioned:
 - implement a systematic contact process to the physical education teachers and headmasters of the schools,
 - where the proper interest risen, holding presentation on the rugby, holding introductory trainings, arranging recruiting actions, providing promotional materials,
 - where the recruiting actions are successful, holding on trainings and having those able volunteers from the currently existing clubs at the area

hold trainings, this is related to the subpoint Mentorship Project within this application point,

- for the properly trained sides at first the organisation of some occasional matches then later the start of regular championship adjusted to the need at that region or country level,
- systematic organisation of his own work, use of all kind of help available
 from the existing first and second division clubs (selecting persons who are
 competent to hold trainings, education for them, to create them the proper
 conditions to help the development work i.e. travel cost reimbursement
 etc.) and the Youth Development Committee under the HRU Board.

The position filler: currently Mr Attila Kardos (31),

The location of the DOS: The office of the Hungarian Rugby Federation, Budapest

Remuneration: gross salary as mutually agreed and budgeted + reimbursement of expenses occurred while working, one lunch a day, moderate level

accommodation cost, travel cost between his work place and living

DOS reports to: the General Secretary of the Federation and the HRU Board, HRU

Mentorship program:

To the reinforcement of this system emphasise shall be put on the regular support of the launched activities. Above volunteers who may train regularly certain teams, a complex network of mentors shall be set up. To its successful implementation, some pure compensation also required at this field.

The task of a mentor:

- undertakes the representation, support of a launched rugby entity of this program, at least weekly regular communication,
- in the matter of difficulty, forwards it to the Development Officer and HRU and they
 jointly tackle it
- as a mentor he/she is preferably rugby player, in his person serves example, strengthen relations to existing rugby sides

The estimated remuneration (kind of lump-sum) for mentors (30 people at crucial points, each would receive 10 pounds/month) each amounts to 300 GBP/months that, concerning the period between September 1998 and June 1999 is 2,7000 GBP

Total amount of this application point is: 9,570 2,700

2. <u>Final construction and completion works of a rugby stadium close to Budapest, namely in Százhalombatta</u>

Goals: to have right of exploitation in a stadium, that is close to Budapest (30 kms), proper for organisation of training camps, national team games and any age grade related events at minimal cost

Background: In the beginning of 1996 on the recommendation of Százhalombatta RFC, that has several national side players, and the head of the local government's Sport Committee, some members of the local government assembly and Mr Imre Rumi town chief architect travelled to England to study the layout of rugby club houses and pitches at the site.

Based on this study, in the year of 1996 all the required planning was made and in September 1996 the local government decided about the use up of 9.6 million forints for the building works of the structures of a clubhouse at the Százhalombatta *Ófalusi* pitch (<u>first stage of implementation</u>). At this stage the supporting structures of a clubhouse of 300 m² were made by January 30 of 1997.

<u>The second stage of the implementation:</u> The local government approved the use up of further 15 million forints. Until June 10 1997 the following works have been done:

- separation walls
- roofing
- plaster works
- joinery works, windows, doors
- water, ducts, heating, electricity, natural gas facilities

some outdoor excavation works

Stage 3 of the construction: The local government approved the use up of another 15 million forints. Until December 20 1997 the following works have been done:

- painting works
- floors and wall finishes
- external finishing works
- expansion of the existing pitch
- implementation of goals
- earth excavation for the implementation of grandstand of the stadium
- implementation of temporary roads and parking area

The total investment until now is: 41,700 thousand forints (about 126,000 GBP)

Stage 4 of the construction: For the proper completion of the stadium that would satisfy all the international requirements as well, there is a planned need of further 31 million

forints. The following works are to be done by December 1998:

- the creation of a hostel area with beds for 35 people at the attic area (300 sq. meters)
- supplying furniture for the building that include all the facilities required for social purposes, i.e. cleaning, dress changing, lavatory, buffet
- finalisation of parking place (about 200 m²) and roads, the finalisation of the grandstand (seats etc.)

Out of these 31 million forints we apply for a grant of 12 million forints from IRFB sources that is 35 thousand GBP. It is 16.5 % of the total investment.

<u>Through this grant</u> Hungarian Rugby Union would possess exploitation for a long term (at least 20 years) as it will be set in a contract that is the condition of forwarding the grant form HRU to the local government for the specified purposes and in the case HRU will receive it from IRFB.

HRU and Százhalombatta Town has already made a letter of intent (see Annex 2/1 and 2/2) on this matter that clearly shows that the dominant exploitation of the whole real estate will be in the hand of the local rugby club.

The contract, that shall be made after May 1998, will include the two major parts: The main areas of utilisation of the provided grants:

- creation of the hostel area at the attic level of the club house
- furniture in the clubhouse
- finalisation on the pitch and the grandstand

The scope of planned long term (e.g. for 20 years) exploitation rights for HRU:

- right for arranging national team and other international games at the pitch free of charge, 10 each years and the rest at net costs,
- right for arranging training camps and preparational sessions for all age national sides in the facility at net cost, according to previous scheduling,
- right for arranging events for school sides as organised by Youth Development Officer

We are aware that the applied grant is a major amount and need probably more information from your side and at the same time we are ready to accept all of your guidelines, legal and financial advice.

However concerning the current financial conditions of rugby in Hungary it is an outstanding chance that is partly implemented by the generous local government of Százhalombatta.

3. Preparation of a Junior National Team that will go to Cardiff in 1999

Background:

The youth development is number one priority in our strategy. We rather play more international matches with age grade national teams than with the senior team using up our limited financial resources.

At this period the best prospects looks at the entering of an U19 side to the 1999 Cardiff Junior World Cup. The age group has already been selected and won against Croatia in June 1997 (then U17 selection).

Our intent is to have as many as possible preparational games both in Hungary and abroad. For having matches abroad our financial resources are not sufficient.

Required activity: Selection, training and matches for the age group national side, players born between 1/1/1980 and 31/12/1981. The trainer is Mr Ferenc Gyolcsos, from Székesfehérvár, who has been the trainer of the junior national side for the last two years.

In this application point we concentrate mostly on matches against teams abroad between June 1997 and April 1999. The possible championship amongst the neighbouring countries is out of the scope of this application (with Austria, Croatia South and North, Bosnia and Slovenia) and we also do not handle now matches against Hungarian club sides.



HUNGARIAN RUGBY FEDERATION'S STRATEGIC DEVELOPMENT AND MANAGEMENT PLAN (DRAFT)

The long term aim of the HRF is to maintain and extend the existence of rugby sport in Hungary while providing all the demanded institutional and administrative obligations originated from duties both internal and external.

The current management structure of the HRF is the following:



Currently a paid employee is the General Secretary who administers the run of the 1st and 2nd division championship, the cadet and junior championship and all relevant internal and external affairs.

Another paid position, through the grant of IRFB, is the School Development officer, whose role is strategical in the exploitation of the development potential of this sport in Hungary.

Main points of development - as a kind of list of short term priorities are set in our project list:

RUGBY PROJECTS IN HUNGARY

(in rank of importance)

- 1. Regular training courses for referees. Expenditures: travel, organisation costs, supporting materials (videos, booklets)
- 2. Regular referee assessment program. Expenditures: travel, organisation costs.
- 3. Run of the U19 and U17 national sides:
 - regular training and matches
 - travel of the national team coach to the 1998 April FIRA World Junior Championship in Toulouse, France
 - participation in the 1999 FIRA World Junior Championship
- 4. Financial support for the work of the Youth Development Officer whose responsibility is the whole territory of the country.
- 5. Regular training sessions for coaches. Expenditures: travel, organisation costs, supporting materials (videos, booklets)
- 6. Run of the senior national team. Regular training, preparational matches, FIRA matches in April and May 1998 vs. Slovenia and Austria.
- 7. Development of the communication and office equipment of the Union.
- 8. Development of an overall professional marketing plan for the HRU.

Above amounts are dated to the fulfilment, they sometimes cover services in the previous months.

Due to the under estimated huge costs on travel, Mr Attila Kardos received the directive from the Youth Development Committee to concentrate on three territories in priority:

- Budapest, the capital, that is the most developed concerning the financial power of the country and the most intensive regarding population,
- countryside between Budapest and Székesfehérvár (to the SW direction), that is also a mini "silicon valley" in Hungary and remarkable rugby tradition exists here,
- Miskolc and its close region that is Mr Kardos's living place (NE Hungary)

Above these directions some advertisements were put onto various media, in case receiving request from any where in Hungary, Mr Kardos has to handle that as well.

Achievement in the goals:

As the figures below show, after tremendous amount of visits and communication roughly 80 schools undertake to develop rugby activities in certain ways that are in a broad scale from simply introducing the sport in the regular lessons occasionally to regular training for groups. These launchings are of course the starts of a long process, and at the current stage no one could say which schools become the flagships of rugby for the long term.

A gut feeling estimation of the potential is shown for each school at column two with I as minimally acceptable and 5 as great potential.

LETTER OF INTENT

Magyar Rögbi Szövetség - Hungarian Rugby Union, Budapest Dózsa György u. 1-3. and

Százhalombatta Város Önkormányzata (local government), Százhalombatta Május 1. tér

on the subject of

the completion works of Százhalombatta Óváros Sportcentre.

- 1. The **Magyar Rögbi Szövetség HRU** will apply for a grant towards International Rugby Football Board (that is the top organisation of rugby in the world) for the implementation of the followings on the course of the construction and final works of Százhalombatta Óváros Rugby Stadium and its club house service facilities:
 - finalisation of the attic area construction in the club house and creation of accommodation site for the purpose of later training camps,
 - finalisation of the outdoor facilities of the stadium matching with international requirements,

at about a 10-15 million forints value.

Details on the utilisation are included in the budget that is provided by the local government and it is part of the application.

- 2. **Local government of Százhalombatta Town** primarily devotes this real estate for the support and maintenance of rugby sport.
- 3. The **Magyar Rögbi Szövetség HRU** shall regularly use this real estate in the future according to its need. In the case of success of the application the rights that will be proportional to the forwarded grant shall be set in a <u>separate contract</u>, this is the condition of providing the grant from HRU side.
- 4. The possible consideration of the application at IRFB side: not later than the beginning of the second half year of 1998.
